In collaboration with Ageility, a rehabilitation services provider, we now offer a range of personalized, onsite services such as physical and occupational therapy.

Campus Upgrades

We continue to make regular improvements to our campus to create a better experience for our residents. In 2022, common areas in our assisted living areas received significant upgrades. We also added a resident computer area and renovated the fitness room in conjunction with the addition of Ageility services.


Outdoor areas were refreshed with new landscaping, patio furniture, and level walking surfaces, making them accessible for all residents.
